

Cross Border Online Retreat for the IBVM CJ Friends of Mary Ward in the UK and Albania

In 2005, after a mandate discerned by the IBVM Congregation to open a new mission outside the borders of every Province in the Congregation, the English IBVM mission discerned, with the help of international NGOs in the UK, to open a new mission in Albania. This new mission was one of 7 new missions established by IBVM in different countries of the world at this time. The Bishop of Tirana, in Albania requested that the sisters going from England to Albania would work against human trafficking. This mission has developed over this time and now an NGO Foundation called Mary Ward Loreto is implementing the work against human trafficking in 6 regions of Albania. Mary Ward is well known and a group of Albanians called the Friends of Mary Ward, meet for prayer and reflection to support them in this challenging mission. In the UK, the Friends of Mary Ward was established in both the CJ and IBVM Congregations and over time they have begun to merge as regional groups meeting also for support, prayer and reflection.

In September 2021, at an IBVM regional meeting, a seed was sown to bring these groups of the Friends of Mary Ward together for a three week directed retreat in daily life, across borders, online. The plan was to begin the retreat during the novena of Mary Ward 2022. As Mary Ward week came to an end on January 30th, 2022, a group of 21 Friends of Mary Ward from Albania and England began this Retreat in Daily Life. It lasted for three weeks, with each retreatant meeting their own director twice a week. The opening and closing meetings were an opportunity for some prayer and sharing together.



So as to not rush the introductions, a preliminary meeting with all the Friends took place a week earlier, taking the opportunity to celebrate Mary Ward's birthday with prayer and a little sharing.

The retreat directors were all CJs and IBVMs from the Irish and English Provinces, and these had an opportunity to meet together throughout the retreat for some prayer, sharing and companionship.

The last word goes to some of the retreatants:

From the Albanians:

A retreat that crosses borders without a passport even in the times of Covid. With Jesus in our daily life, hearts begin at every distance. Thank you all for this opportunity.



The retreat did not only help me personally, but also my family and my students as well. God showed up in every step of my life with my family, friends and students. His presence has developed my self-confidence, has matured me more in my actions and in my understanding how important is to have God in your life.
