I thank God for the beautiful gift of Mary Ward, who inspires us by her virtues of truthfulness, freedom, courage, justice and joy which are linked with integrity. These are the essential elements of the Charism of Mary Ward, the Founder of the Institute of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Loreto Sisters) and the Congregation of Jesus (CJ). More than 377 years since Mary Ward's death, about 5000 vowed members from different countries have been inspired by the life and charism of Mary Ward. My personal reflection on the saying of Mary Ward "Women in time to come will do much" is that it was her conviction and a deep desire and longing to liberate the women of her time. It shows how strong was the faith she had in women and girls and she was ready to stand for them at any cost.

Mary Ward is God's gift to the church and to the world, as she brought a new dimension, especially to women. She made it possible for women to be involved in the field of education and hence in preparing girls and women for a new role within the church and society. Mary Ward strongly believed that, "Women in time to come will do much".

We see how Mary Ward's dream and desire for women have been fulfilled in our own country today:

Perseverance: Saina Nehmal, who had the unique distinction of being the world's No. 1 at the age of 17 years. She says, "It is tough to win the World Championship but I love it and feel good, at the same time I have to work hard and train everyday".

Leadership: Sonia Gandhi is the first woman to be the President of the Congress Party for a long time; more than two decades, due to her good leadership and loyalty to the party and country.

Justice: Kiran Bedi is the first woman to join the Indian Police Service. She is one of the most renowned police officers who has put in her wholehearted effort in serving the society.

Daring: Patricia Mukhim, is an Indian social activist, writer, journalist and the editor of Shillong Times, known for her Social Activism.

Knowledgeable: Zoya Akhtar, a writer, a filmmaker, a producer and a director who melds serious issues with oodles of style especially for the good of society.

We are proud to say that what Mary Ward had dreamt has come true for women today. Many women are standing tall for themselves today in society and the country.

IGNATIUS CORNER

SR BIVIYANA



"What do I love when I love my God"?

Ignatius assumes in his discernment of spirits that God communicates directly with each of us in our hearts, minds and souls through various interior movements. Ignatius experienced this while he read the life of Christ and the lives of the Saints. Reading the life of Jesus and the Saints made him happy and aroused his desire to do great things. He was clueless of these internal movements and how to discern God's direction for him.

I remember that very special day when I heard a voice from within saying "come out from your comfort zone". I was shaken, confused and disappointed. I questioned, what exactly this voice meant for me. It disturbed my internal peace. So, I decided to sit quietly and listen to God in stillness so as to understand its depth of meaning in my life.

The Lord gave a clear answer to my quest; wherein he revealed to me that spirituality is not only theoretical but it must be lived through our daily lives. Here I got to know the deep meaning of spirituality which involves the recognition of a feeling (sense) or belief that there is something greater than myself, something more than the human and sensory experience, and that we are part of the cosmic or divine nature.

What do I love when I love my God? Sometimes I sit and reflect on the same and what dawned on me is that God has created each living being and non-living being, (cosmos), the nature. Each of these is in want of love. Anything we do without love is meaningless. I experienced that He treats me like a child who learns to walk but falls. He upholds me and leads me like a father, mother, elder brother, sister and a true friend. In my helplessness I experience His nearness. When my steps falter, He lifts me up. My weakness and slowness fail to grasp His true love for me. He loves each one of us immensely and tenderly and no one in the universe can replace this. Ignatius believed that “anyone who prayerfully considers the basic truth that we are created out of love by a transcendent God of holiness will grow in a sense of reverence”. We will have a true sense of the sacredness of all things, if we think of everything as continually being called and sustained by God. We will stand in awe not just before sunset and mountains, flowers, and trees, but also before every person we meet. In Ignatian terminology, reverence of His creation will enable us to find God in all things.

Misinterpreting and misunderstanding is human. God transcends the beauty and sweetness of His work through us, yet our experience of God is mysteriously anchored in our everyday experience of His love. When I express that I love God it’s an expression that is shared with everyone I live, interact and come across. It calls me to see His love being manifested in His creation and demands from me that I uphold the dignity and true worth of every human being.

The year 2020-21 was a unique experience for me. It has made me discover my strengths and my weaknesses too. It has also helped me to become who I am today. The experiences of every day have made me strong in my belief of reality. I've grown in confidence, believing in my strengths and have become independent.

In September 2020 I returned to Kolkata as my visa expired and since the pandemic continued, I spent my time in Kolkata till September 2021 helping in different communities as I was instructed and as the need arose. At that time I went through good and not so good feelings. I was feeling good that I could adapt myself anywhere, where the need arose but on the other side when some situations came where I felt I belonged nowhere in particular, I experienced acceptance as well as rejection too. Those times I really questioned myself about my existence but slowly I learned to live my life one day at a time.

This experience of ups and downs taught me to be patient with myself and with the situations I encountered. I was really not sure whether I would return to Bangladesh again and so I had a big question mark about it but deep down a voice of hope continued to knock my belief which made me patient with my feelings and the situation. I learned to be positive about things.

My outer world was very pleasant but in my inner world I struggled daily. Those days I missed my mother a lot who would listen to me with no judgment. But, I found my only support from Christ, "The laughing Jesus" was my visual image and so I had many conversations with Him. The daily rosary also was my weapon to fight and overcome my negative feelings.

Battles in life never end. Many times I felt that maybe God did not want me to be here because I got discouraged by many people questioning me as to why I wanted to go back to Bangladesh. At some point I also felt I was not wanted (I may or may not be wrong but it was my feelings) and my only answer was - 'I am called for a mission, it does not matter for me whether I work here or there'. Some people also misunderstood my coming back to Bangladesh. But I continue to work willingly and joyfully every day.

As the saying goes... experience is the best teacher - I believe with my little experience now, I have learnt to trust in God for his right time to do miracles. I have learnt to be patient with situations, patient with myself and have learnt to be self confident.






Prayer Service:

We also had a wonderful Christmas celebration with the girls on the 19th. We had a very short programme and gifts were exchanged. Dinner was served. It was a beautiful evening.



He asked sixth-grader, Noah, to help him to carry them.


"I could," he said, "but I'd prefer not to."
